





Paul Deo's artwork has been featured nationwide in venues including the Museum of Natural History, galleries, motion pictures, film festivals, private collections and on the college lecture circuit. Deo began producing art concerts combining art, animation and music. "Paintings on canvas, sculptures, and murals are the more traditional mediums I utilize to develop a space for my stories," remarks Deo. One of his latest projects is a 75' x 60' mixed media mural *House of the Rising Sun* that will be published as a book. Deo had invented and registered patents for pervasive computing and cyber kinetics. He has worked on more than 80 films, music videos, and commercials as a conceptual visual designer, producer, and director. A New Orleans evacuee, Deo and his family are currently rebuilding in Harlem, NYC.

George Ingmire holds a B.A. in Anthropology and an M.F.A. in film production. In New Orleans, he works in music production, audio restoration, field recording, and film sound. Most recently, George produced the sound for the *Dukes of Hazard* DVD and completed a series of post-Katrina audio essays examining the impact of the storm on Mardi Gras Indians and one of the oldest African American churches in the US, Saint Augustine Church. *The Spirits Choose Whom They Will* is George's film about the cross-cultural collaboration between two Voodoo societies, one in Haiti and one in New Orleans. Ingmire's award winning short documentary about a boy with Down Syndrome, *Think of Me First as a Person* was recognized by the National Film Registry in December 2006. George received awards and grants for his works. He is also a fixture on New Orleans beloved public radio, WWOZ



Dan Sheridan's NOOMOON started in 1994 as an event management company in Michigan. Soon thereafter, Dan started a clothing line, combining fashion and music performance around Detroit. NOOMOON toured with *Ozzfest*. The group would perform impromptu shows combining tribal rhythms with belly and fire dancing to attract crowds around their clothing tent. This inspired Dan to launch *Worms Union*. NOOMOON vended and Worms Union performed at *Woodstock 99*, *Bonnaroo* and Free Tibet Concerts in New York and San Francisco. The producers of the *Voodoo Music Experience* in New Orleans gave NOOMOON their own stage to book each year. In 2006, Dan started a video production company, *NOOMOON Pictures*. They released *Musical Therapy*, a documentary of the first Mardi Gras after Hurricane Katrina. Today, NOOMOON produces *Land of NOD Festival*, a music and art festival on 105 acres in Jackson, Michigan. www.noomoon.net • www.noomoonpictures.com

Current economic conditions have caused arts organizations and other non-profits to re-examine their strategies for meeting increased demand for services with reduced

Regional arts organizations can initiate several strategies in response to the current fund raising climate. Arts groups must re-focus on their core mission, with the possibility of discontinuing programs outside the mission area. Boards of directors can become more engaged in the fundraising process, working hand-in-hand with staff to preserve donor relationships and develop new sources of funding.

Expanded partnerships and collaboration with other nonprofits, such as education and environmental organizations, is a proven method

for pooling scarce resources to meet growing community needs. And some arts organizations have merged with similar groups in order to strengthen the ability to provide services

and the capacity to broaden community support.

Although the recession is showing signs of abating in urban areas across the country, an economic turnaround is not expected for rural Oregon for at least the next three to five years. Arts organizations must continue to connect with their communities, reach across service areas to create new partnerships, and make a convincing case for the arts in everyday life. Our quality of life is positively affected by the work of artists in all disciplines. We mus continue to support these individuals and organizations during these tough economic time and assist them as they prepare for a better future.

K.U. STORIES showcases the vibrant history of Klamath Falls' oldest high school, Klamath Union, with tales from its alumni, students, and faculty. It was released as a citywide fundraiser in early 2011.

#### THE COLLECTION PROCESS

In intimate interview sessions, subjects were asked to account humorous instances, love stories, human-interest stories, tragedies, and triumphs. Other topics that were covered were hazing, traditions, sports, clubs, faculty, fashion, the caste system that exists in high school, and the buildings themselves. "It's been like examining historical archives, except the archives are people," says Ryan Pfeil, one of the project's key production members. Special emphasis was placed on alumni with multiple generations of KU alumni. "There was a tremendous turnout for the 50s," quotes director, Dan Benson. The first participant to come forward was Tom Schubert. The student who graduated in 1951 returned to KU as faculty in 1970 and spent 22 years as the assistant principal. Two months after being filmed for K.U. STORIES, Tom passed away. "It reiterated the importance of capturing these stories before it was too late," explained Christy Soto, executive director of the film's producer, The Creativity Collective.

#### THE CREATIVE FORCE BEHIND THE DOCUMENTARY

The project began in 2007, when the fledgling Creativity Collective (then known as Project: Shoot Southern Oregon) were brainstorming ideas for a large-scale film project. "It looked as if this historic high school was about to be torn down, but believe it or not the real incentive for doing the project was to explore what makes high school such a powerful life event. What makes those four years such a special time that people have reunions decade after decade to commemorate the experience?," says Soto. All four of the project members had been involved in film prior to the project. Dan Benson was an award-winning underwater videographer. Christy Soto attended film school in New Orleans. Mike Stier had created titling software for Apple programs and applications. Ryan Pfeil was an award-winning videojournalist.


#### THE FINAL CHAPTER

Almost immediately, a cult-like popularity grew for KU STORIES. The project's Facebook page topped 3000 friends, many who messaged their stories to the administrator. One of the project's early crew members, Collin Dow, got permission for The Creativity Collective to use the KU yearbooks. Gail Wade, class of '58, offered 25 yearbooks from her personal collection. When Dan got the 60 hours of video down to a manageable 2 hours, Ryan wrote the script. The crew approached thespian and film enthusiast Chip Massie to be the ghostly "custodian through the years"--the glue that held the decades together. "Think Dick Van Dyke from Mary Poppins," adds Soto. Dan approached local musicians and bands to provide music.

#### THE FUNDRAISER

Part of the mission statement of the Creativity Collective is to ensure arts resources are available to the community. The Creativity Collective donated a dollar from the sale of each DVD to help fuel a city-wide fundraiser to raise money for arts programs for the schools. Much like a walkathon, students will be given forms to collect sponsors for each DVD sold. "This was a creative way for us to spread the value of KU STORIES. It might be about KU, but there are many other fine schools in Klamath Falls that deserve a nod as well," adds Soto. To contribute a prize to the award pool, contact Christy Soto at 504-957-5820. The Sit-Down Comic





### Copyright Law & the Creative Professional by entertainment lawyer Kohel Haver



In my experience as an attorney specializing in working with creative professionals, there are two reasons why it is important, regardless of the media, for a creative professional to be familiar with the basic principles of copyright law: You want to know how to protect your work and to control how (if at all) others get permission to use it. You want to know how to use someone's material either with permission, or know how much you can use without asking permission. The basic premise of copyright law is as the author of an original work you have the right to control any making of copies of the work. The original work is protected by copyright. The exclusive rights under the copyright law give the artist the right to control unauthorized exploitation of their works. Copyright is a "federal" law and the law does not vary from state to state.

### What Kind of Work is Protected by Copyright?

Copyright protection is available for "original works of authorship fixed in a tangible medium." A work is "fixed" when it is made "sufficiently permanent or stable to permit it to be perceived, reproduced, or otherwise communicated for a period of more than transitory duration." Only minimal creativity is required to meet the originality requirement. No artistic merit is required. Justice Holmes said in the 1903 case Bleistein v. Donaldson Lithograph warning against using aesthetic criteria in a legal question, "the policy judgment that encourages the production of wheat also requires the protection of a lot of chaff" – the test is originality not creativity. The Copyright Act states that works of authorship include the many types of work:

- Literary works. Novels, nonfiction prose, poetry, newspaper articles, magazine articles & magazines, etc.
- Musical works. Songs, instrumentals and recordings. A recording of music sounds and words.
  - Dramatic works. Plays and skits. This would include how-to demonstrations as well as pantomimes and choreographic works such as ballets, modern, and jazz dance, and mime.



### Keeping Cameras Rolling in Southern Oregon

Roll Sound... Roll Camera... Action! As a resident of Southern Oregon, you might not expect to hear those words very often, certainly not like in Los Angeles, home to the Hollywood film industry, or even in Portland, which has seen a recent upsurge in filmmaking. But in fact, cameras are rolling in Southern Oregon all the time, and Southern Oregon Film and Television is right in the thick of it. The region has been host to westerns and romances, thrillers and comedies. Notable past films include "The River Wild" with Meryll Streep, "Dead Man" starring Johnny Depp, and the classic film "Stand By Me." Most recently, several recognizable stars were in the Rogue Valley filming the sports film "Calvin Marshall." B-movie megastar Bruce Campbell made his last film here, right on his own property--in fact, outside of Jacksonville, called "My Name is Bruce."

There's actually a lot of us here: Directors and producers, writers and cinematographers, editors and animators, gaffers and scouts, makeup artists and more. As a resident producer myself, I like to think that we can make just about anything in the area with what we've got locally. We even have helicopters with state-of-the-art camera stabilization mounts and a special effects expert who knows how to blow stuff up!

The beautiful locations throughout the region are another main reason why Southern Oregon is a fantastic place to make films. From the rugged coast to the magnificent desert, up on high mountaintops to down in low river canyons, in modern glass and steel office buildings, down sleepy country lanes, through quaint neighborhoods and into stylish vineyards, we've got just about every environment but big city urban. The local population welcomes filmmaking with great cooperation and excitement.

Even the highest levels of the state government are in support of filmmaking. The Oregon Film Office administers an effective financial incentive for filmmakers. Because of these rebates on the money that productions spend in Oregon, the state attracted its highest level of filmmaking – more than 63 million dollars – in 2009. Best yet, financial impact studies show that the incentives are a moneymaker for the state, that they have a net-positive effect on our state budget. The unofficial incentives that

assist in making Southern Oregon a "good deal" for filmmaking are the low and no cost permits, inexpensive locations, local acting talent, and no state sales tax.

Filmmaking in Southern Oregon isn't always the perfect scenario. For example, weather must always be taken into account. Of course, it's our weather that makes much of the scenery so striking. The relative remoteness of the region is another thing to account for, despite being centered around Interstate 5, and having an airport that reaches the west coast through direct flights. In response to the growing activity and interest in filmmaking in the region, Southern Oregon Film and Television (SOFaT) was founded to act as a local film commission

and professional organization for "the business." SOFaT also welcomes businesses that provide support services, film students, and enthusiasts. As SOFaT grows, so will the chances that one day while walking down the street, you'll hear: "Roll Sound... Roll Camera... Action!"



- (continued from Page 21) Pictorial, graphic, and sculptural works. Photographs, posters, maps, paintings, drawings, graphic art, display ads, cartoon strips and cartoon characters, statues, and paintings.
- Motion pictures and other audiovisual works. Movies, documentaries, training films and videos, television shows, and interactive multimedia works. Obtaining Copyright Protection not the same as Copyright Registration.

Copyright protection is automatic when an "original" work of authorship is "fixed" in a tangible medium of expression. Registration with the copyright office is not required but it is very helpful especially when enforcing your copyright against infringers. Only a registered copyright holder can have access to the courts and demand to recover their attorney costs and get that presumption of damages up to \$150,000 per infringement. Also among the benefits of registration is the legal presumption that the work is yours. This is very valuable. You can register the work electronically on the copyright office web site www.copyright.gov using the general Electronic Copyright form – you can upload a digital copy of the unpublished work. The e-registration costs \$35. In the next issue we will discuss the rights the copyright holder has under the law, how to enforce your rights, what is a license, and how to write one, what is a "work for hire" and how it shifts ownership of the rights in your artwork, what is "fair use," and common misunderstandings about copyright. 
